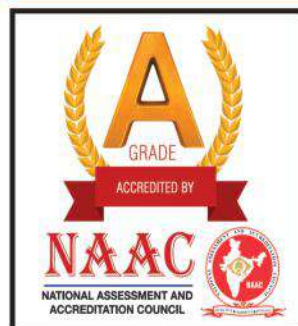

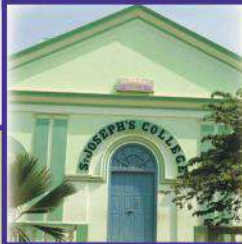

St. Joseph's College

The College

St. Joseph's College is a legacy of the 19th century, handed down to the present management by the venerable fathers of the society of the Foreign Mission of Paris. Its nucleus was the St. Joseph's High School which was started in 1868 A.D. This School was elevated into a college in 1884 A.D. through the efforts of Father Tarbes and was affiliated to the University of Madras. The District-Gazetteer, South Arcot District, has recorded that the prime educational institution and the only college in the District in the 19th century was St. Joseph's College. It once again became a high school in 1909.

The college was reborn as St. Joseph's College of Arts and Science in 1991. The college was inaugurated on 11th October 1991, at a stately function presided over by His Excellency Bhisma Narain Singh, the then Governor of Tamil Nadu. The college obtained Permanent Affiliation on 07.03.2008 and the Autonomous Status on 17.06.2008. The college has been re-accredited with 'A' Grade (3rd Cycle) by NAAC.

The college has been conferred the Minority Status by NCMEI, New Delhi and has been recognised under sections of 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act 1956.

The Management

The College is run by the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore under the guidance of the Archbishop Most Rev. Dr. Antony Anandarayar. The Archdiocese has been rendering its services in the field of education, health and other social activities for more than two centuries.

St. Joseph's College of Arts and Science (Autonomous) has its own Governing Body with the Archbishop as its Chairman.

To provide quality education through curriculum at par with that of reputed institutions of higher education, innovative teaching, competent and qualified teachers, supportive systems and by processes of on-going evaluation and continuous refinement leading to holistic development of the student community.





INFRASTRUCTURE

LIBRARY

The college is equipped with a fully computerized library, functioning on the basis of an 'open access' system. It houses over thirty thousand books and subscribes to national and international journals / periodicals and popular newspapers. Students are provided the facility of computers with internet connectivity and access to e-journals. Besides the college library, students are also offered the facility of Departmental Libraries.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The college is among the best in the university as far as the laboratory infrastructure is concerned and as a 'science' college this is of paramount importance. We have state-of-the-art equipments that are used for regular teaching as well as for projects by students and teachers. They are sufficient in number to ensure that each student gets hands-on learning experience in the laboratories.

RESEARCH

To promote research in the college a Research Development Cell has been established. Research contributes content to teaching. Any quality teaching draws on quality research. Keeping this in mind. St. Joseph's engages its faculty in sound research, by providing infrastructure and other support services.

CURRICULUM

As an autonomous college, St. Joseph's College follows the semester pattern with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) requiring 3 years of study for an under graduate degree programme and 2 years of study for a post graduate programme in Arts and Science. The medium of instruction and examination will be English. Broad, balanced and relevant curriculum provides opportunities to acquire the necessary skills and qualifications to succeed in the global marketplace. Strong emphasis is given on developing the core skills of Literacy and Numeracy alongside a blend of traditionally academic, vocational, creative and technical learning options.

TEACHING

We believe that teaching and learning experiences should be stimulating, enjoyable and innovative. A wide variety of teaching strategies are used to personalise learning to ensure students fully access the curriculum. These encourage creative, independent approaches to learning, allowing our students to excel.

LEARNING

Our range of extended learning opportunities such as after college study support and mentoring system, plus excellent ICT facilities, provide students with the resources to enhance their learning and meet their expectations.

We believe that all learners are entitled to suitable and challenging learning experiences regardless of their abilities and needs.

MENTORING

Mentoring, supported by Heads of the departments, provide a pivotal role in promoting learning, personal development and well-being. They provide an essential point of contact for students and parents during their course of time here. Students are constantly monitored and a range of welfare and academic interventions are employed to ensure students achieve, feel safe and happy in our community.

INTEGRAL DEVELOPMENT

We expect high standards of behaviour and excellent presentation of uniform to foster a sense of responsibility and self-discipline in our students. We instil the key values of Pride and Respect, which is a constant theme of assemblies and our Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development programme.





Student Support Services

CO-CURRICULAR AND WELFARE PROGRAMME

St. Joseph's inherits social service clubs such as National Service Scheme, Rotaract Club, National Cadet Corps, Youth Red Cross, Rover Crew, Social Service Club, Citizen Consumer Club, Red Ribbon Club, Fine Arts Club and Village Service Learning Programme to inculcate social justice and incorporate community development.

Women's Empowerment Cell, The Health Club, Enviro Club, etc. are the welfare programmes to the students.

A variety of sports and games enabled campus provides a wide scope of encouragement for the students who excel in sports.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

The college has excellent facilities for sports and games, such as, Basketball, Football, Table-Tennis and other indoor games.

St. Joseph's is the best among the colleges affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University to produce more number of International, National, State Level players.

THE FINE ARTS ASSOCIATION

The Fine Arts Association conducts both intra- and inter-college competitions in events such as classical, western and folk dance, music, choreography, dramatics, creative writing, photography, painting and rangoli. It also organizes the inter-college annual festival 'Zephyr' every year.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FEE CONCESSION

For the students who belong to the Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe and Minority communities, scholarships will be facilitated as per Central Government Scheme.

Fee Concession will be granted on different categories (Free Education / Half Concession / Random Concession / Sports) to the students who are economically poor / excelling in academics and also excelling in sports.

Students wish to avail scholarship and Fee concession should apply for the same with necessary application forms available in college office.

HOSTEL

The institution provides hostel for boys with spacious rooms and a conducive atmosphere for study. Facilities for indoor, outdoor Games are also available. A separate hostel for girls is made available within a walkable distance from the college, which is run by the Sisters of Don Guanella.

CAFETERIA

St. Joseph's-Café, the college's cafe is located on campus, adjacent to the Mithri Bhavan (Guest House). It offers a variety of snacks and dishes.

PHOTOCOPYING AND PCO

Photocopying and PCO services, on payment are conveniently available on the college premises.

PLACEMENT CELL

The placement cell provides an organized corporate interface for St. Joseph's students. The cell is committed to tap the market that has come to recognize the sound academic training of the graduate.
