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Empowering the Irula Tribe

1. Introduction The Empowering the Irula Tribe Program started in 2018 and focussed on community transformation of the Irulas. The Department of Social Work of our institution has created awareness programs to change the mindset of parents and children of *Irula* tribal communities in Parangipettai block and other nearby villages in Cuddalore district so that they value and pursue education.

2. Program Overview

Primary Location: Shanmuga Nagar, Cuddalore.

Objectives: Improve literacy rates among Irula children and adults through community transformation.

3. About the Irulas

The Irula tribe inhabits the Indian states of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and Karnataka. In Tamil Nadu, they are mainly concentrated in the northern districts. The Irula people speak the Irula language. Traditionally, the Irulas have been skilled at snake and rat catching, as well as honey collection. They work as labourers during sowing and harvesting seasons or in rice mills. Fishing and cattle farming are also commonly followed occupations.

4. Problems faced by Irulas

- Lack of Access to Education.
- Social Exclusion and Discrimination
- Marginalization and Displacement.
- Bonded Labor and Livelihood Struggles.
- Lack of Employment
- Inadequate Housing and Basic Amenities
- Lack of legal rights to occupy land
- Vulnerable during Natural Disaster

We have come to know in our assessment about the Irula in Shanmuganagar and Tiruvalluvar Nagar that school dropouts among children was a major problem and lack of awareness in many areas was another serious issue of this community.

5. The underlying principles or concepts guiding the program are:

- a. Community-Centric Approach: Ensuring that solutions are tailored to the specific needs and context of the Irula community.
- b. Sustainability: Designing interventions that have a lasting impact beyond the program's duration.
- c. Inclusivity: Ensuring that both men and women benefit from educational opportunities.

6. The Practice: Key Activities

- a. Students of MSW interacted with the parents individually at their houses emphasizing the need to encourage their children to go to school.
- b. Collaborated with local schools and various departments of the college to organize workshops on basic literacy, numeracy, and life skills.
- c. Engaged students, parents, and teachers to foster a supportive learning environment.
- d. During the tribal awareness camp, MSW students have conducted programmes on the following topics:
 - i. sensitizing programme on health hygiene practices
 - ii. role of parents in child development,
 - iii. say no to child marriage and yes to education
 - iv. Importance of education for children's future,
 - v. financial management,
 - vi. awareness on ill effects of alcohol consumption,
 - vii. motivational talk on women empowerment,
 - viii. sports events for the all-age groups and distributed the prizes to the students as a motivation to education.
 - ix. street plays on need of education.


As a part of the programme, Computer Literacy Programme organised by the department of Computer science.

- e. Focus on the welfare of the Girl Child: The Department of Social Work highlighted the importance of girl child education for societal progress through street plays which opened the eyes of the parents to give education to the women in *Irula* community. Presentations on women's education, supported by powerful visuals and engaging dialogue, resonated deeply with audiences, emphasizing the need for community and institutional support to enable girls to pursue their educational aspirations.
- f. Additionally, they gave awareness programmes about
 - i. legal protections
 - ii. welfare schemes
 - iii. preventive measures to empower children through child line in effectively supporting children's education and welfare.

5. Uniqueness in Indian Higher Education Context

- 1. Indigenous Focus: Few outreach programs specifically target ST communities.
- 2. Holistic Approach: Integrating education, health, and livelihoods.
- 3. Partnerships: Collaborating with local NGOs, schools, and government bodies.
- 4. Training: The Program acts as a platform for training students and staff members in skills required for social service and community transformation.

6. Evidence of Impact:



1. Education:

- o Increased School Attendance: Irula children attended school more regularly.
- The number of school **dropouts reduced drastically** parents continue to enroll their children in schools.
- One of the notable outcomes is the increased enrollment of female students in higher education, with many of them starting to attend school consistently.
- One Girl has finished her B.Sc. Nursing and now she is working in a clinic. Two students are pursuing a postgraduate programme and one student is doing an undergraduate programme.
- This shift in perspective has led to higher enrollment rates and has ensured that more children receive a formal education.

2. Community Engagement:

There was a Positive Attitude Shift in the community

- (a) Many individuals who were previously oblivious to the value of education and the purpose of schooling have now experienced a transformative change.
- (b) The parents felt the importance of education for their children, so they sent their children to school.
- (c) Overall, the *Irular* community has been empowered educationally by our intervention through extension activities.

3. Long-Term Impact:

The long-term impact of this program is estimated to be significant. Educated individuals are more likely to secure better job opportunities, contribute to their communities, and lead more fulfilling lives. As a result of these activities, there is a huge impact in Shanmuganagar, Thiruvalluvar Nagar and nearby localities

7. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- 1. Traditional Norms:
 - o Some community members resisted change due to entrenched gender roles.
 - \circ Sensitization workshops addressed these cultural barriers.
- 2. Infrastructure Required: Locally situated schools, libraries, and vocational training centres.
- 3. Funding: Securing sustainable financial support for the extension program.

8. Resources needed:

- Human Resources: Trained teachers, counsellors, and community mobilizers.
- Materials: Books, stationery, and technology for e-learning.
- Healthcare: Regular health check-ups and nutrition support.

9. Recommendations and Future Pathways for Empowerment

- 1. Establish community-led committees to continue educational initiatives.
- 2. Strengthen SHGs and vocational training programs.
- 3. Advocate for government support in infrastructure development (schools, healthcare centers).
- 4. Promote policies that recognize tribal rights and address their unique needs.

10. Conclusion

The Irula outreach program exemplifies the transformative power of education and women's empowerment. By fostering collaboration, understanding, and resilience, we've taken meaningful steps toward a brighter future for the Irula tribe.

The Tribal Awareness Camp for the year 2019 took place from September 3rd to September 9th at three locations: Killai, Thiruvalluvar Nagar, and Kalaignar Nagar in the Parangipettai block of Cuddalore district. The program was organized by first-year students as part of their curriculum requirements, with the goal of raising awareness about various societal issues and creating a sense of responsibility.

The students arrived at Killai at 12:00 pm and began collecting survey data on the topic of the socio-economic status of the Irular community. The camp's inauguration ceremony started at 6:00 pm with a motivational talk on the role of parents in instilling values. Residents of Killai gathered for the event, which featured the honorable chief guests, Rev. Fr. Alex (Dean of Studies & Head, Department of B.Com Bank Management & BBA (CA), St. Joseph's College of Arts and Science, Cuddalore) and Mr. Syed VN Sagab (Dargah Office, Killai). The program was inaugurated in a commendable manner.

Mr. J. Durai Raj, Head of the Department of Social Work at St. Joseph's College, provided an introduction to the camp, explaining its purpose, the impact it aims to have on tribal communities, and the planned events for the week. He encouraged attendees to make the most of the resources provided during the camp.

Rev. Fr. Alex then addressed the gathering, emphasizing the importance of parental roles in nurturing values. His talk was interactive, especially with the children of Killai, and he urged students to pursue their education rather than dropping out, assuring that the college would support the Irular community's educational needs in the future. He also shared motivational stories that inspired the children to value learning.

Following this, Mr. Syed VN Sagab offered his thoughts on the environmental efforts in the Pichavaram area, encouraging students to make use of the camp's offerings. Mr. Poora Sami, a key community organizer from Thiruvalluvar Nagar, praised the initiative and congratulated the organizing team for their dedication to a noble cause. He also commended the department for their efforts in setting up the camp. Mr. Selva Arokia Raj, Director of Florence Home in Killai, also addressed the gathering, urging participants to take advantage of the program's resources.

The first-year students then performed cultural activities, including skits, songs, and mime performances, all centered around the theme of the role of parents in instilling values. The program concluded at 8:00 pm.

She emphasized family planning benefits, suggested healthy- parenting practices, and encouraged spacing births. 
