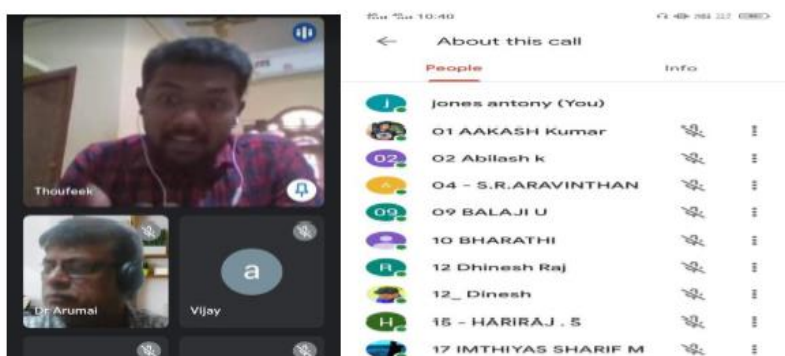





- To help students to learn how to answer difficult questions.
- To develop interview strategies.

- To gain the power of positive thinking and self-confidence.
- The study sessions they built your ability to perform well and boost your confidence.
- To gain knowledge on Interview Skills.

The Department of Commerce (Bank Management) organized a Capacity a Mock Interview on **23.05.2022 (Monday)** for the (Bank Management) Shift I students. Rev. Fr. Dr. A. Alex, Dean of Studies, Head, Department of Commerce (Bank Management) & Business Administration (CA) convener of the programme. The programme was Co-ordinated by A. Domnic Xavier Assistant Professor Department of Commerce (Bank Management).

Level-1:

Aptitude Test:

Aptitude test given to students to determine which type of careers they might be good at. Aptitude test was conducted as a pen paper test in which questions were set to assess the ability of the candidates through different testing formats. They could include questions like

number series, arithmetic aptitude, profit & loss, simple interest and compound interest and percentages.



APTITUDE TEST CONDUCTED

Level-2:

Group discussion:

Students were made to sit in groups and keep discussions constructive and positive. Make discussion functional by clarifying the goals of each session to the group. And, on important topics needed to face an interview such as

- The Challenge to be faced in every field
- Ways to present oneself in an Interview
- Importance of a captivating resume etc...
- Students were also given business related situations and were judged on how they reach a solution to a problem.



Level-3: Personal Interview

In this round every single student was interviewed personally, and questions were asked to them.

A few common questions were asked.

1. Describe yourself.
2. Why do you want a job?
3. Why should we hire you?
4. What motivates you?
5. Describe your work ethics.
6. What makes you unique?

We invited our past-out students **Ms. Pragatheeswari S & Ms. Elothi Noel** to address on how to face interview with Companies on **23.05.2022**. They are our department Alumni (2018-2021) and they shared their experience of how they were selected in the **Accenture solutions Pvt Ltd**. They shared some motivational tips on how to face interviews with confidence and the role & importance of communicational skills which must be developed. Through this program students can reduce stress before their actual interview. The department of Commerce (Bank Management) Shift I -71 students participated in that programme.
