Suggestions Made for all the Departments

Following are the suggestions made by the experts in the concerned departments.

I. Curriculum

- PO/CO/PSO needs to be updated with Bloom's Taxonomy.
- PO, PSO and CO should reflect Vision & Mission of the Institution
- The no. of PSOs can be limited.
- Syllabus can be modified based on the students' feedback. Physical feedback can be more meaningful.

- During Syllabus formation or revision – feedback from industry experts could be obtained
- Action Taken report based on the suggestions from alumni/ subject expert / students/ parents/ industry experts
- Extra-credit system shall be incorporated beyond the 140 credit points.
- Internal – External Proportion of 25:75 shall be improved to 30:70. The proportion of 35:65 shall be upgraded systematically through the curriculum development committee and academic council.
- Remedial classes shall be utilized for gap rectification beyond subject performance (communication/presentation skills shall be improved).
- Textbooks and reference books should be updated.
- TNSCHE/UN/UGC model of curriculum upto 70% could be incorporated.
- Practical papers can be included in the commerce subjects.
- Question paper blue print for accounts papers can be given.
- Certificate course can be included in the mark statement.
- Students should be encouraged to participate in all the courses.
- All the faculty members and UG/PG/M. Phil students can be motivated to join SWAYAM/NPTEL and others online courses.
- Still more value added courses can be added.

II. Curriculum Transaction

- Experiential learning can be video documented and uploaded for the self-improvement and publicity.
- Making use of Google platforms will create more efficient communication of activities performed.
- E-learning materials can be increased. Virtual labs and bioinformatics softwares and database for practicals can be used.
- All contents must be uploaded in college website because when evidence is given in NAAC SSR, only the link in the college website has to be given.
- Projects can be implemented for all the UG departments.
- ALL Staff members can encourage the students to apply for student project schemes.
- PG/M.Phil student projects are to be deposited in the department library.
- Field related problems or studies are to be given as UG Projects

III. Faculty Profile

- Staff should be aware of funding agencies.
- Project can be applied to ICSSR, UGC and Govt. agencies.
- Material resources prepared by the staff can be given to the students
- All the staff members are suggested to act as resource persons.
- Staff can apply for PhD guideship.
- Seed funds offered by the college can be utilized by the departments by way of writing internal projects. This will encourage the staff to apply for funding agencies.
- Staff publications must be improved. They must be encouraged to publish in the scopus indexed or SCI journals.
- Staff can organize more E-programmes like webinars/ workshops/ FDP/ Orientation/ Refresher courses. Staff should try to conduct UGC sponsored seminars/workshops.

- Staff can be encouraged to participate in the FDP programmes organized by ATAL or by recognized bodies.
- Professional body membership shall be established.
- Staff need to undertake online NPTEL Swayam courses for NAAC score
- Certificate Courses could be conducted.
- Swayam courses can be included into the curriculum in the form of credit transfer approved by BoS and Academic Council
- Soft Skills courses could be added to Value added courses
- 2 day / 5 day seminars/conferences are only accepted by UGC

IV. Profile of Students

- Awareness can be given to Plus two students in and around Cuddalore by way of organizing competitions and quiz programmes etc.
- Students can be encouraged to participate in more inter-collegiate competitions, seminars etc.
- First and second year students can be allowed to take part in industrial visits and internships.
- E-content collection shall be made (Youtube and other videos; e-book collections)
- Industrial visit report must contain the student feedback to remain more meaningful learning.
- Innovation/creative ideas of students shall be presented in innovation/proposal contests.
- Alumni talk series/ CEO talk series/Industrial talk series/ Entrepreneurial talk series can be arranged.
- The students participated and who were awarded in various clubs, NSS, NCC, VSL, Rotary, YRC, Consumer Club, RRC etc should be included in student's achievements.
- YUVA club can be started.
- Yoga classes can be started in the department level on working days every year.
- Social and public awareness programmes can be conducted by the department students.
- Details of passed out students CS, CMA, CWA should be included with certificates.
- Best alumni awards can be instituted for the department.
- PG final year students can be instructed to apply for NET/SET in the final semester.
- Field-work projects for PG could be initiated
- PG projects need to checked for plagiarism and certificate needs to be attached
- Creative assignments could be given to PG students.
- Remedial classes for the UG/PG arrear students in every semester to be arranged.

V. Infrastructure of the Department

- In each room LCD can be installed
- Management can provide separate research lab for Ph.D program.
- LED bulbs can be provided for each class room
- Separate dustbin (composable, decomposable) can be provided
- Printers can be provided to the teachers

- Autoclave, Laminar cell count can be provided (For Microbiology).
- Licensed Software can be purchased (SPSS).
- UV Spectrometer can be purchased.

VI. Activities of the Department

- At least 5 MOU must be established by each department
- The departments can have the MOUs with laboratories and corporate sectors.
- Under MOUs, activities can be implemented.
- Consultancy works either free or paid must be documented accordingly.
- Collaboration with local industries shall be established and through which internships shall be developed.
- Collaboration could be thought of with various other research centre and educational institutions
- Roadmap for achieving milestones proposed in 1 year and 5 year plan must be laid to verify the progress.
- FDP/Refresher programme may be organized for nearby school teachers
- Extension activities can be organized regularly.
- Department e-Newsletters could be thought of and Department Magazine could be improved containing materials/writings/drawings/ from students in large number
- E-newsletters can be published every semester by each department.
- Departments need to maintain report & certificate, Letter from the agency of the visit, Call letter, Van Invoice, Bills, Toll Gate or permission letter from the Principal for industrial visits.

VII. General Recommendations:

- B.A. Economics can be started.
- B.Sc Psychology can be started.
- For MA English Syllabus – a course can be added for Competitive Examinations like NET/SET with MCQ type
- Scientific Questionnaire must be administered for collecting feedback.
- Students and Alumni can take part in the board of studies meeting
- Action Taken Report must be available after the feedback is received.
- Student satisfaction survey on teaching learning process can be conducted. Action Taken Report must be generated and discussed.
- Refinement of CO, PSO, PO must be undertaken. In writing CO forbidden Action verbs must be avoided.
- Evaluation of attainment of outcome must be undertaken.
- Steps can be taken to make more students pass NET/SET/ Competitive Exam. Action Taken must be available for each venture after conducting the programmes.
- Developing a well-equipped centre to train the students for competitive exams can be aimed.
- For differently abled, infrastructure is to be made available. The campus should be differently abled friendly.

- Seed money for Research in terms of incentives for paper publication in Scopus, WOS, SCI journals to be given
- Staff members can explore the possibility of attending international seminars
- Students can be informed about the chances available for studies in other countries
- All the Departments must have smart class room facility. It should be used optimally. Log book should be maintained for the usage.
- Students from other states can be admitted in UG/PG programmes.
- Research Collaboration to be established with foreign and Indian universities
- Students summer training collaboration to be established with academy /industry
- VSL can be extended to all students
- Steps can be taken to make more students pass NET/SET and Competitive Exams.
- Career Counseling could be initiated for the PG and final year UG students.
- For Placement, MOUs can be signed with industries, companies and training centres.
- Placement can be improved and the data should be maintained.
